<b>Order No. 23</b> <b>July 19, 2013</b>	<p>Heard. Perused.</p> <p>Issues of Ambient Air Quality parameters, traffic management, road construction and road diversion etc. were under consideration and for that purpose the study was directed to be made of the said issues through the Department of Civil Engineering IIT, Powai, Mumbai. Estimate for study was also called for. However, it appears that the estimates given by the IIT, Powai, Mumbai would weigh heavily on the <i>purse</i> of the Applicant and others and the need for pruning down the estimated cost is felt.</p> <p>With this need in mind, this Tribunal vide order dated 5th July, 2013 proposed to segregate the work of air sampling and analysis of Ambient Air Quality parameters from the other work, and give this work of Ambient Air Quality parameters study to CPCB to prune down the cost-estimate of the study. In this context, it is submitted by the Counsel appearing for the Applicant that a joint meeting between the Director of IIT, Power, Mumbai and CPCB could facilitate chalking out of the programme of the study as proposed and giving of the estimated cost of such joint effort.</p> <p>Mr. Rajkumar, Learned Counsel representing CPCB, on instruction of the Senior Law Officer, submits that some reasonable time is required to arrange for such meeting and to revert back to this Tribunal with an adequate response on the estimate cost as well</p>

as the matter in issue.

It is hoped that the meeting between the Director of IIT, Power, Mumbai and CPCB leading to final estimate of cost and work schedule would be completed within two (2) weeks and the parties revert back to this Tribunal with their responses within four (4) weeks hereafter.
