	We have heard learned counsel appearing for all

11	The Joint Inspection Team had inspected 28
	Hospitals-the details of which have been placed on
	record. According to the Report of Inspection, these
	Hospitals are not following the bio-medical waste Rules in
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	its true spirit and substance. In fact the inspecting team
	has made various recommendations to the various
	hospitals which they require to be complied with at the
	earliest. Bio medical waste can cause serious health
	hazards. There are Hospitals like Hindu Rao Hospital,
	Delhi where according to the Inspecting Team even bio
	medical waste is being collected in open trolleys. There is
	no proper colour scheme to be followed for suggestion of
	such waste and there is no system to dispose of such bio
	medical waste as per the Rules.
	Safardjung Hospital, Kalawati Swaran Childrens
	Hospitals and Lala Ram Swaroop Institute of
	Tuberculosis and Allied Diseases are amongst such other
	Hospitals.

According to the Inspecting Team even the private Hospitals are not complying with the bio medical waste rule strictly. Even to the Noticees in the present case including Max Super Speciality Hospital, Indrapastha Extension and M/s Fortis Escorts Heart Institute and Research Centre Ltd. Okhla directions have also been issued for compliance of order to ensure that there is no breach of such rules.

Learned counsel appearing for all these Hospitals state that they have complied with the directions of the Joint Inspection Team. Be that as it may, majority of the Hospitals in NCT of Delhi are not complying with the biomedical waste rule and are thus posing a very serious hazard threat to human health and environment.

comply with the directions issued by the Joint Inspection Team within four weeks from today. If the directions issued by the Joint Inspection Team and CPCB are not complied with in the time specified above, we direct both Delhi Pollution Control Committee (DPCC) and CPCB to launch prosecutions against the Director and Medical Superintendent of the respective Hospitals.

We make it clear that if such prosecution shall be launched against the defaulting Hospitals and their authorities, it shall be without prejudice to the proceedings initiated for violating its order under the provisions of the National Green Tribunal Act, 2010.

We direct that after expiry of four weeks from today, the Joint Inspection Team of the CPCB and DPCC shall inspect all these 33 Hospitals and submit a status report in regard to the compliance of recommendations of inspection team as well as to answer whether the collection and disposal of biomedical waste of these Hospitals is in anyway likely to cause any health hazard.

We also direct this Committee to place on record mercury phasing out programme for the Hospitals which are still using mercury instruments like blood pressure measuring guage and thermometer etc. The Report shall specifically state as to which of the Hospital has already dispensed with the use of mercury in their medical diagnosis and treatment.

Learned counsel appearing for State of Haryana submits that the Hospitals which they have inspected are complying with the biomedical waste rules. The list of such Hospitals has been furnished in Court today. we direct the Joint Inspection Team to inspect any 5 amongst these Hospitals including small and the big and report to this Tribunal as to whether they are complying with biomedical waste rules or not.

Learned counsel appearing for Uttar Pradesh Pollution Control Board (UP PCB) submits that a large number of Hospitals have been inspected. However, he has information regarding only 23 Hospitals, which have been inspected. Out of them, 20 Hospitals are violating the biomedical waste rules with impunity and only 3 are following such rules.

Let the UP PCB launch prosecution against these Hospitals before the next date of hearing as well as to file its final Report with regard to inspection of various Hospitals.

The State Pollution Control of Haryana as well as the UP PCB shall file Report positively before the next date of hearing.

We direct CPCB as well as DPCC to identify the approved recycler of plastic waste. We make it clear that only those concerned Units should be approved which are capable of strictly adhering to the collection, treatment and disposal of biomedical waste or the plastic waste as per the Law.

Stand over to 19th July, 2013.

In the meanwhile, the State Pollution Control Board of Haryana and CPCB shall inspect the Unit of Respondent No. 4 to bring on record the worth of allegations made by the Applicant against the said Respondent before the next date of hearing.

Notice be issued to all the Hospitals.
