<p>Order No. 7 August 6, 2013</p>	<p>We have heard Learned Counsel for the parties.</p> <p>We have perused the status report filed by the Respondent No. 3 and also by the Central Pollution Control Board.</p> <p>What appears from the status report is that Punjab Pollution Control Board (PPCB) has closed-down three industries and one of the industries owned by Mr. Pyara Singh got closed down itself. Mr. Pyara Singh is reported to have taken away all the machineries and equipment installed in the premises. Hence there is no question of running of that industry by Mr. Pyara Singh. The Counsel for the PPCB makes a statement that the same industry will not be allowed to run again without consent of the PPCB. The Learned Counsel further makes a statement that appropriate monitoring process will continue to be done.</p> <p>The Learned Counsel for the Applicant submits that the Applicant will apply to the PPCB for consent and only after such consent is received, the industry of the Applicant may be permitted to operate.</p> <p>The Applicant is running small industrial unit of manufacturing combs. If required the Applicant shall also obtain necessary permission from the Municipal Council or other competent authority</p>

inasmuch as the small industrial unit is being run in the residential area. We grant two (2) weeks time to the Applicant to take necessary steps to apply for consent and other formalities and inform this Tribunal about his bonafides to get such consent. In case of non-submission of Application for consent, we will be constrained to dismiss the application.

The application for consent by the Applicant, if so filed, shall be expeditiously decided by the PPCB.
