The Hotel shall use solar panel for generation of power.</p> <p>We therefore dispose of this Application with liberty to the Project Proponent to continue with his project, however, strictly subject to compliance of the undertaking given by it and afore-noticed and, which are accepted by the Tribunal. Furthermore, we direct that as per maps submitted today, the SPA constructed at point 'C' and cottage constructed at point 'A' which portion admitted fall within the 100 meters of the river Ganga shall be demolished immediately.</p> <p>Learned counsel appearing for the Applicant vehemently argues that the construction falling within 100 to 300 meters from the middle of the river are subject to regulatory regime in terms of the judgment dated 10th December, 2016 passed in Indian Council for Enviro-Legal Action Vs. National Ganga River Basin Authority & Ors. in Original Application No.10 of 2015.</p> <p>We direct that the permission to carry on with the project is strictly subject to the said regulatory regime and as and when the said regulatory regime comes into force the Project Proponent shall be duty bound to abide by the same.
