Item Nos. 32 to 37 March 07, 2017 sn It is stated upon instruction from the Secretary of the Ministry that the primary object of the Ministry is to clean and rejuvenate river Ganga, however, it is further added that wherever certain areas are required to be cleaned to ensure prevention and control of pollution of river Ganga, the Ministry even would do the same.

We Issue Bailable Warrant against Municipal Commissioner, Nagar Nigam Kanpur for him to be present before the Tribunal on the next date of hearing with complete records, in the sum of Rs. 25,000/- to the satisfaction of the arresting Officer, in exercise of our powers and in terms of the provision of Section 19 (4) (a) of the National Green Tribunal Act, 2010 read with Order XVI Rule 10(3) and Section 151 of Code of Civil Procedure, 1908. The bailable warrant shall be executed by the SHO of the area under whose jurisdiction the office of the Kanpur Nagar Nigam falls.

We may notice that not only the Commissioner has not appeared despite direction but even officer of the Nigam has not been present before the Tribunal with relevant records. Learned Counsel appearing for the State of Uttar Pradesh submits that he had conveyed the directions of the Tribunal requiring them to act accordingly.
