Learned Counsel appearing for the Ghaziabad Nagar Nigam submit that they are taking all steps in the right perspective, despite which, there is still sufficient quantity of MSW to be removed from the site where till now dumping was being done and will identify the place i.e. Pratapvihar, Ghaziabad which is ideally suited.

We may notice our order dated 28th February, 2017 vide which we have issued 5 directions to the Nagar Nigam, regarding which no statement has so far been filed. We accept the request of the Learned Counsel appearing for the Ghaziabad Nagar Nigam to give them a week's time to file written reply and at the same time, direct the Nigam to explore the possibility of out-sourcing the MSW composting to avoid further continuous degradation of the atmosphere and adverse impact on the environment besides the life the local residents,

Pending objective assessment of the proposal/
preposition of outsourcing and steps to be taken for
further solution, we direct Nagar Nigam to conduct
periodically health check up camp for the residents
who are adversely effected by such pollution and to
provide them sufficient required medical treatment and
assistance. Periodical medical inspection of the
residents shall be conducted by due publicity and at
least once in 10 days or maximum 15 days. The Chief
Medical Officer Ghaziabad shall personally ensure
