Local Commissioner's report placed before us reveals certain facts particularly with regard to the detection of Bio-Medical Waste in Municipal Solid Waste. It is not only surprising but poses questions as to what is the position presently as regards disposal of Bio-Medical waste in the State of Jammu & Kashmir. We, therefore, direct the State of J&K and the State Pollution Control Board to place before us the facts concerning Bio-Medical Waste disposal and Common Bio-Medical Waste Treatment plants in the major cities in the State on the next date.
