	been planted under the scheme of afforestation. It is further submitted that they have permission from the
	Competent Authority to fell 6000 trees. This statement is disputed by the Learned counsel appearing for the
	Applicants. According to them they have already fell more
	than 15000 trees approximately and they do not even have proper permission from the Competent Authority.
	Furthermore, afforestation as stated has not been done.

In view of the disputed facts, we direct Senior Officer from Regional Office of MoEF &CC to visit the area in question along with the Applicants, Officers of the Respondents on 2<sup>nd</sup> and 03<sup>rd</sup> January, 2017 from 10.00 AM onwards on both days. The inspection, if needed, would continue on day today basis, till its conclusion. The composite report by the State – Officer should be submitted before the Tribunal, in regard to the trees that have been cut/fell for this project and afforestation thereof and the likely impact of felling of large number of trees on the environment and ecology of the area as it cannot be disputed that it is a eco – sensitive area and has effects on wildlife habitat. Let the report be positively filed before 14<sup>th</sup> January, 2017.
