Ugly tips Apply cosmetics with care. They contain carcinogens

A six-month assessment of 10,500 ingredients in 7,500 personal care products by Environmental Working Group, a US-based research organisation, shows that cosmetics contain a range of elements, from harmless components like table salt to cancer-causing chemicals

The personal care product industry, which is worth US \$35 billion, remains unregulated as all product safety testing is done by a selfpolicing industry safety committee, the Cosmetic Ingredient Review (CIR) panel

Only 28 of the 7,500 products analysed have been fully assessed by the CIR panel. 99.6 per cent ingredients have never been tested for potential health impacts

One of every 100 products on the market contains ingredients certified as known or probable human carcinogens. Commonly, eight probable human carcinogens are used — coal tar, benzyl violet, formaldehyde, lead acetate, progesterone, selenium sulfide, nitrofurazone, and silica

51 per cent products assessed contain "penetration enhancers", ingredients that increase a product's penetration through the skin into the bloodstream, hence increasing exposure to these harmful components

 Scientists have linked exposure to hair dyes with increased incidence of bladder cancer among hairdressers, barbers, beauticians and cosmetologists Dibutyl phthalate, a reproductive toxin that targets the male reproductive system, is widely used in nail polishes. The European Union plans to ban it in cosmetics by the end of 2004

> The CIR panel has spent an average of one hour and ten minutes deliberating the use, toxicity, and safety of each ingredient reviewed over its three decade history
