The trade effluent shall be analysed and the analyses reports placed before the Tribunal. If the report submitted before the Tribunal is favourable to the industry and it is found compliant and non-polluting the consent order will be issued but same would become operative subject to the orders of the Tribunal. In the event of default the Unit shall be closed forthwith.

The complete report with regard to water consumption should also be submitted.

Once the report is submitted to the Registry the same shall be registered in accordance with rules and place the same before the Tribunal for directions. We make it clear that that report should positively be filed within two months as directed above.

Accordingly, M.A. Nos. 35/2016 and 36/2016 stands disposed of without any order as to costs.
